About Cisco Spark Spaces

The core of Cisco Spark is the space. A space is a virtual meeting place. In general, you must have been added to a space to participate in that space, or you must have created a space yourself. It is also possible to create spaces that are open to everyone within an organization. Such spaces let you join in without permission.

Spaces can consist of groups of people or be just direct messages between with two people.

Spaces are used to communicate and to share content.

Do not Disturb



Your system can be set to not respond to incoming calls. You may, however, still use it to call others as much as you want.

Your video support team may have set a time-out on this feature, after which the system will return to respond to incoming calls as usual. Default time-out setting is 60 minutes.

To activate the Do not Disturb feature tap the icon in the upper left corner and activate it in the corresponding menu.
